1 Corinthians 13:6

Big Idea: Our love should rejoice with the truth

What does it mean for love to rejoice with truth, not at wrongdoing?

3 markers of love that rejoices with the truth:

5. Spend time inviting each other to rejoice with the truth that is going on in your lives at home, at work, in your neighborhoods. Praise God for the opportunity to participate in rejoicing with truth together.
