- How do I glorify God in my thinking?
  - Answer: The cross shouts the importance of purity/righteousness and calls our thoughts to come in line with its standard. It calls us out of idol thoughts and impure thoughts to thinking on things that are pure, lovely, commendable, excellent, and worthy of praise (Philippians 4:8).
- How do I glorify God with my money and things?
  - Answer: Use them to make other people satisfied in Jesus (2 Corinthians 8:9). At the cross Jesus became poor in death to make us rich in life and relationship with Him.
