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## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

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1. Does your family have any traditions around Lent and/or Easter? What are they and what do you love about them?
2. Do any of these traditions help you reflect on the sufferings of Christ on the cross? What is the value of traditions like these?
3. Reread Matthew 21:1-11 and Matthew 26:6-13. What jumps out at you from these stories?
4. Where is your life not what you would have expected or hoped for? How has that affected your relationship with Jesus?
5. Can you see any way that your trials have given you the opportunity to display that Jesus is King?
6. Can you imagine, or have you seen, that your trials can make Him more fully (functionally) your King?
7. How can we develop devotion to Jesus for who He is, which is not dependent on our expectations and hopes being met or unmet?
