- 3. Read Psalm 127. What lesson about work stands out to you most in this Psalm?
- 4. Why do you think the Psalmist uses raising children as his example of work in which we are completely dependent on God?
- 5. The Psalmist is promoting the truth that we are completely dependent on God for anything to come from our work. He doesn't offer much in the way of how to get God's power and pleasure behind our work. What have you experienced regarding the type and way of work God puts His power and pleasure behind? How has that impacted you?
- 6. The Psalmist references the pointlessness of anxious toil. How can we know if we are driven by anxiousness in our work? What is the alternative?
- 7. What is one thing that needs to change about the way in which you approach the different work in your life?
