UNDERSTAND THE TEXT



Read definitions of important words and concepts.

“patient in tribulation” - *Tribulation refers to suffering or persecution. Patience in tribulation means to persevere and to endure with strength. It means trusting in God's plan and His timing, even when life is painful or confusing. Paul is reminding the Church that our hope in Christ is what gives us the strength to endure. Because of this, we must stay connected to God through rejoicing and prayer, especially during trials and tribulations in life.*
