Romans 14:1-4

As for the one who is weak in faith, welcome him, but not to quarrel over opinions. ²One person believes he may eat anything, while the weak person eats only vegetables. ³Let not the one who eats despise the one who abstains, and let not the one who abstains pass judgment on the one who eats, for God has welcomed him. ⁴Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? It is before his own master that he stands or falls. And he will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make him stand.

ANALYZE THE TEXT



Write what you don't want to forget.

Am I strong or weak in faith?

Why is fighting over opinions dangerous?

How do I know if I'm fighting over essentials or areas of liberty?

UNDERSTAND THE TEXT



Read definitions of important words and concepts.

"...eats only vegetables" - *This doesn't mean people were like modern-day vegetarians. Rather, people understood that some meats available in the market had been sacrificed to pagan idols. Some Christians chose to refrain from eating these meats out of personal conviction, even though Paul says there is nothing inherently sinful about eating the meat, as long as the person doesn't worship the idol they were sacrificed to.*

APPLY THE TEXT
